Highlights of the 2014 Preliminary Budget:

- ·Amount to be raised by taxes is \$215,750.00
- ·General and Highway Funds: The estimated tax rate is \$2.0393/1,000, an increase of 0.0587 over 2013.
- ·Sewer District: \$0 to be raised by taxes. O&M will be \$100.00/unit/quarter (\$400/yr), and debt service will be \$0. There are 315.50 units.
  - ·Water District #1: \$100,000.00 (301.5 units) is the amount to be raised by taxes
- ·Water District #2: \$64,438.00 is the amount to be raised by taxes, with the Town of Byron having 164.5 units and the Town of Stafford having 25 units for \$9,048.00.
  - ·Water District #3: \$5,905.00 (9 units) is the amount to be raised by taxes.
  - ·Water District #4: \$5,217.00 (11 units) is the amount to be raised by taxes.

## **PUBLIC COMMENTS:**

**Pete Yasses:** Why is there so much of a surplus budgeted for A1620.4 (Buildings Contractual)? He would like to see it reduced from \$38,000 to \$28,000.

**Highway Superintendent Heins:** The extra money is in the account in case something happens.

**Pete Yasses:** What is Machinery Equipment for? Do you spend it at will, or do you need approval of the Town Board?

**Highway Superintendent Heins:** Would like to get a new sweeper, if the opportunity arises. Do not need to bring it before the Board if it's bought at auction.

**Pete Yasses:** On hospital/medical insurance (DA9060.8) in the highway account he spoke with Billy Kennett and he said he's not going to take the insurance, he will continue to take the in-lieu of.

**Highway Superintendent Heins:** You need to keep it in there in case Billy needs to take the insurance, and with Obamacare you don't know how much health insurance is going to go up. If the money's not used, it'll go back into unexpended balance.

**John Sackett:** Why isn't there any revenue under sale of water? He saw someone getting water out of hydrant. What is minor sales? What is Per Capita Aid – is it really Per Capita Aid or is it AIM? Is unexpended balance being used so the Town doesn't have to raise taxes?

**Councilman Wooton:** He's proud of the budget and the fact that the Board didn't have to raise the tax cap when a lot of other towns are doing so.

**Pete Yasses:** Discussed meeting with DEC that was held today regarding the increase phosphorus at the South Byron filter bed.

**Highway Superintendent Heins:** The first step they said would be to do a reed filtration system, which usually works.
