SUPERVISOR'S REPORT:

•Received 3rd quarter sales tax check in the amount of \$177,908.38, which is \$3,626.43 less than last year at this time.

Regarding the Budget question Councilwoman Fuller had during the budget meeting: She would like to know why there is \$3,197 in the budget under SS1990.4 (Contingency) when there hasn't been any money in that line item at least for the last 3 years – the \$3,197 was used to balance the sewer budget per Baldwin's Office.

OTHER BUSINESS:

•Dan Cohen from the Cohen Law Group was at the last GAM meeting and a lot of the Towns in Genesee County are using him to negotiate new franchise Agreements. The Town's Time Warner Cable contract expired last year, and after speaking with the Town Attorney, Paul Boylan, the Supervisor and Paul have decided the Cohen Law Group would be better suited to negotiate the contract. Their fee would be around \$5,100.

WATER DISTRICT NO. 5 LOAN FROM GENERAL FUND AND REPAYMENT SCHEDULE RESOLUTION #74:

Councilman Cudney offered the following resolution and moved for its adoption:

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the General Fund paid certain pre-formation expenses for Water District No. 5 in the amount of Ten Thousand One Hundred Ninety-Three and 58/100 Dollars (\$10,193.58) and that said expenses are not payable from either the Rural Development Loan or Grant, and

WHEREAS, it is therefore necessary that said amount be repaid to the General Fund by the consumers of water in the District by a special assessment,

NOW THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, That Water District No. 5 repay the General Fund the amount of Ten Thousand One Hundred Ninety-Three and 58/100 Dollars (\$10,193.58) for each equivalent unit during the years 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020 to be applied exclusively to the District's debt to the General Fund, and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Town Clerk and the Assessor shall transmit this Special Assessment to the County Legislature and County Treasurer in order to effect the levy of this assessment on the tax bills to be issued by them on behalf of this Town.

This resolution shall take effect immediately.
