# **HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2015 PRELIMINARY BUDGET:**

- •Amount to be raised by taxes is \$226,600.00
- •General and Highway Funds: the estimated tax rate is \$2.1216/1,000, which is an increase of 0.0823 over 2014.
- •Sewer District: \$0 to be raised by taxes. O&M to remain at \$100/unit/quarter (\$400/year), and debt service will be \$0. There are 315.50 units.
  - •Water District #1: \$104,500.00 to be raised by taxes (301.60 units).
- •Water District #2: \$62,912.00 to be raised by taxes, with the Town of Byron having 164.70 units, and the Town of Stafford having 25 units for \$9,250.00.
  - •Water District #3: \$6,608.00 to be raised by taxes (9 units).
  - ·Water District #4: \$5,343.00 to be raised by taxes (11 units).

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS:**

John Sacket: What is the Adult Recreation line item for?

**Town Clerk Debra Buck-Leaton:** It is for adult recreation at Gillam-Grant. **John Sackett:** What is the \$1,100 Local Youth Recreation Revenue line item?

Town Clerk Debra Buck-Leaton: It is revenue the Town gets from NYS for the Town's recreation

program.

**John Sackett:** What is the Celebrations line item for?

Town Clerk Debra Buck-Leaton: It is for the Heritage Festival.

**Carrie Capostagno:** She would like to see more money given to the Local Recreation Program. It is a great program, and she would like to see the Town support it more financially.
