A <u>motion</u> was made by Councilwoman Fuller to approve the Byron Town Board minutes of November 4, 2015 and November 10, 2015 as written, except that on the November 4th meeting minutes, page 1, acceptance of minutes, Councilwoman Fuller approved of the minutes, not Councilwoman Freeman. PLANNING BOARD REPORT:

Proposal by the Planning Board: Planning Board member George Squires stated that the Planning Board would like to create a Comprehensive Plan Committee consisting of the Planning Board, 3 or 4 community members, and a Secretary, which would all be paid. The Planning Board doesn't feel they can complete the Comprehensive Plan in a timely manner if a committee is not established. Supervisor Yasses stated the Town Board would like to see some progress. The Planning Board hopes to be ready by March to hire a consulting firm to help complete the Plan.

·Per Supervisor Yasses the Planning Board needs to have 4 hours of training per year and the Comprehensive Plan community members do not need training, therefore he believes the Comprehensive Plan Committee should be paid \$25 per meeting, with the Chairman receiving \$30 per meeting, and the secretary should be paid \$10 per hour.

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN COMMITTEE

However, they believe residents installing free standing solar array systems should still go before the Planning Board for review. The Planning Board believes the Zoning Ordinance needs to be amended to include definitions. Supervisor Yasses with contact the Town Attorney, Paul Boylan, to see what steps need to be taken to amend the Zoning Ordinance.
