<u>ADOPTION AND AMENDMENT TO THE TOWN OF BYRON ZONING LAW</u> RESOLUTION #107:

Councilman Kent offered the following resolution and moved for its adoption:

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Byron ("Town Board") has reviewed a Short Form Environmental Assessment Form (EAF) Part 1, prepared by the Town Attorney on the proposed adoption of an amendment to the Town of Byron Zoning Law to regulate the construction, maintenance and de-commissioning of devices designed to convert solar energy to electricity, herein after designated as "Action"; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has determined that said Action is classified as a Type 1 Action under the State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board determined that said Action is subject to a coordinated review and approval by other involved agencies under SEQR regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board determined that it is the most appropriate agency to insure the coordination of this Action and will provide written notification to involved agencies, for the purposes of conducting a coordinated review and making a determination of significance therein under the SEQR regulations.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT:

RESOLVED that the Town Board does hereby declare its intent to be designated as the Lead Agency for the Action, and identifies that it is a Type 1 Action pursuant to SEQR and be it further

RESOLVED that the Town Clerk is hereby directed to provide notice hereof to the involved and interested agencies, seeking their agreement (or objection) thereto in writing on or before January 13, 2021.
