·According to Superintendent Heins and Councilman Wooton, Attorney David DiMatteo is preparing to take the union negotiation matter to arbitration. Several attempts have been made to negotiate with the union to no avail.

•Councilman Thompson believes the \$4,000 spent to pay Attorney DiMatteo would have been better spent paying the union employees their raises and settling the contract.

A <u>motion</u> was made by Councilman Thompson to approve a Union Contract with the highway employees to include a \$.40 raise to be paid retroactively, with all other provisions from the 2007-2010

Union Contract to remain the same. The Union Contract will be in effect until December 31, 2014. The motion was seconded by Councilman Redick and was not carried by the following vote:
