#### LEGAL NOTICE SPECIAL MEETING TOWN OF BYRON

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE, that the Byron Town Board will hold a Special Meeting on Wednesday, September 4, 2019 at 7:00 p.m. at the Byron Town Hall, 7028 Rte. 237, Byron, New York. The purpose of the Town Board meeting will be to discuss the possibility of hiring a law firm to assist the Town Attorney with specialized legal services.

Debra Buck-Leaton Byron Town Clerk **Supervisor Rouse:** He contacted a couple of attorneys and one got back to him stating that he would have to check to see if he had a conflict of interest.

**Paul Boylan:** The Board is looking for someone to work with him to help represent the Town during the Article 10 process. Paul would be able to help negotiate the PILOT and Host Agreement for the Town. He believes the Town may be able to put some restrictions on solar, i.e. height, screening.

There was a discussion amongst the Town Board and the audience regarding the Article 10 process, amending the Zoning Ordinance, what restrictions could be put on solar, how to find out whether the residents of the Town are for or against the solar project, the Comprehensive Plan positive results regarding green energy, whether or not the Town should form a committee to help the Town Board navigate the Article 10 process, and the upcoming informational open house that Excelsior is holding next Tuesday, September 10<sup>th</sup> at the South Byron Fire Hall.

Councilwoman Fuller was dismissed from the meeting by the Town Attorney because she has signed a lease with the solar company, which he believed caused a conflict if she were to vote on anything related to the proposed solar farm.

A <u>motion</u> was made by Councilman Klycek to have Paul Boylan, Esq. represent the Town of Byron, to interview other legal firms to assist with presentations and negotiations, explore solar options and to hire another attorney to assist him in the Article 10 process.

Councilman Thompson seconded the resolution.
