### REMINDERS

- -Decorations and flowers may be placed between April 1st and October 1st .
- -Kindly place moveable pots or containers in line with the monument, this helps with mowing the grass.
- -Please do **not** place any glass containers in the cemetery.
- -Live plants (trees, shrubs or flowers) should <u>not</u> be planted in the cemetery without the Byron Cemetery Association's permission. They require maintenance that need to be taken into consideration. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

**NEW SIGNS** ~ You may have noticed new signs at the cemetery. Two signs at the entrances display the rules, a map of the cemetery and the superintendents' contact information. The main sign on Townline Road has been updated. We are very grateful for several people who helped in this project. Tom Chapell, the owner of Visual Impact Graphics, graciously designed and made the signs at no charge. John Durand constructed the holders for the new signs and Pete Yasses provided topsoil needed to edge the signs. 
