From the Supervisor's Desk

Hello and Happy Summer. Let's hope it's finally here to stay.

We have spent the first half of the year still tying up loose ends. We also have been very busy with new projects. Swamp Road water district is well on its way, with any luck it could possibly go to bid by Fall/Winter of this year. We, the board, have approved to begin a new water district for 5 houses on Cockram Road East from Route 237, and the extension of North Byron Road to Transit Road. Anyone who has received a water survey and has not returned it; please do so at this time. It is very important that these surveys get returned so that we can determine if there is enough interest to continue to the next step.

We are working with the Town of Bergen to come to some kind of solution for the problem both towns have had with the ATV's on the West shore. At our meeting we met with an ATV Club that has shown interest in helping both towns with this problem. Anyone concerned about this ATV problem should feel free to attend a town board meeting, we welcome your input.

For those of you who don't know, there has been a study done on the future fire protection in the Town of Byron. This report is called the CGR report, which stands for Center for Governmental Research. The purpose of this study is to assist the town with current and long range plans for the future fire companies and Genesee County Emergency Management. A steering committee has been formed to discuss the CGR report, and all viable options.

In closing, let me say that I have learned a lot in the last six months. It has been trying, challenging, and fun. If you have any concerns about any of the above mentioned items or anything else, please feel free to attend a town board meeting. They are held the second Wednesday of every month at 7:00 p.m. I welcome any and all input. This is your Town!

As you know, the Town is in the process of conducting a Dog Census. It is very important that you return the postcard you received from the Town asap. If you are found to have an unlicensed dog, you will be charged an additional fee plus be served with a court appearance ticket. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Genesee County Legislator, Robert Bausch

This spring, the Legislature has been addressing a variety of capital projects. All of them are designed to benefit county residents.

The most significant project is the communication / radio system used by the police, fire and medical personnel in Genesee County. This was approved by the Legislature in May, 2013 and the contract was awarded to Harris Communication. Because of FCC requirements, aging equipment, and significant coverage issues, an upgrade was warranted. Previously there were three towers covering the county that left major gaps in coverage (Bergen being one of them). With the new system, additional towers are being built in Alabama, Darien and Bergen (by the water tower at the corner of Rts. 33 & 19). The new equipment on the three original towers was activated in February and the three new towers will go on line in August. The total project cost with land acquisition, equipment & technical consultants will be approximately \$11M with 40% grant funded.

Anyone that has called the county on a regular basis is aware of the telephone issues. Again, the equipment is antiquated and replacement parts are difficult to obtain. The Legislature has approved the purchase of a new phone system which will be fully operational by November. This system will cost approximately \$650,000.

There will also be a number of road and bridge projects this summer designed to address the deteriorating highway infrastructure.

The Legislature continues to review options for the long term financial viability of the county nursing home. During the past few months the county's efforts have focused on identifying another facility, or group of facilities, as a potential partner to share services and administrative expenses. Unfortunately, no potential partner has been identified.

In closing, Genesee County is fortunate to have two county owned parks: Genesee County Park & Forest in Bethany and DeWitt Recreation Area in Batavia. These two parks are beautiful and heavily used. Tim Hens, P.E., Highway Superintendent and Paul Osborn, Park Supervisor, and their staff, working with a group of dedicated volunteers, manage to keep both parks in excellent condition for everyone's pleasure. If you have never visited either or both of these parks, please take time this summer and enjoy these great assets.

Historian

First the Museum is now open on Sundays from 2p.m. to 4p.m. until Labor Day, volunteers permitting. The Museum has volunteers from the Historical Society that open the Museum. It is still open by appointment if you wish to do research.

I came across a news article from the Batavia Daily News dated Saturday 9-22-1962. I'll quote the first part. "It was May 10, 1893, and the engine 999 was hauling the New York Central's Empire State Express 150 miles from Syracuse to Buffalo. When he passed Batavia, N.Y., Engineer Charlie Hogan looked ahead at 36 miles of straight and level track. Back came the throttle, inch by inch, bit by bit, the valve cut-off shortened. The tall driving wheels spun 350 times a minute...400....430....and more. A miles whizzed by 40 seconds, another 38, and finally....31.2! The tall, lean, steam-powered racehorse of the rails (its 7-foot driving wheels towered above Hogan when he stood beside them) had gone 112 1/2 miles an hour."

If my figures are right and he was going from Syracuse to Buffalo he had to go through South Byron to get to Batavia. Though he wasn't going 122 miles an hour when he went through South Byron he was traveling about 60 miles per hour. The article goes on to tell that the engine still exists and is in a museum in Chicago.


