From the Supervisor's Desk

The Swamp Road Water District will be going out to bid soon.

Water District No. 6 (North Byron Road and Cockram Road East of Rte. 237) has been formed, and we are awaiting approval from USDA to move forward.

The new records retention room in the Town Hall is now complete, and this will allow for more secure space for necessary records retention.

The Town Board has completed the 2015 budget, with a Public Hearing held on November 6th. The amount to be raised by taxes is \$226,000.00. The estimated tax rate is \$2.1216/1,000, which is an increase of 0.0823 over 2014.

The Town Board will be holding a Public Informational Meeting on Monday, December 15th at 7:00 p.m. at the South Byron Fire Hall to discuss the formation of a possible fire district between the Byron Fire Department No. 1 and the South Byron Volunteer Fire Co., Inc. All interested parties are invited to attend.

Please remember that the Town Board meetings are held on the second Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. Please try to attend, this is your Town!



Genesee County Legislator, Robert Bausch

At the Legislative meeting on November 24th, the county budget was passed with a \$0.18 per thousand decrease in property taxes. A number of items converged to make this reduction possible: strong revenue projections, reduced retirement expenses and a minimal increase in expenditures (and in some cases an actual decrease). It remains to be determined how long this reduced tax rate can be maintained, but at least it is a reality for 2015.

As has been widely reported, the county did seek and receive bids for the county nursing home. The legislature is reviewing these bids and is in discussions with the leading contenders. Because these negotiations are ongoing, only a limited amount of information can be provided but the bids were favorable to the county and the nursing home should be sold in 2015.

Because of the financial drain the nursing home and other commitments have placed on county finances, roads and bridges have been neglected. With the anticipated sale of the nursing home and being relieved of the obligation to subsidize its operation, the legislature is now developing a plan to aggressively address county roads and bridges.

In August the county sought bids for a new airport terminal and maintenance hangar. The current facility is more than 50 years old, has significant maintenance issues, is not a safe distance from the runways and does not meet users' needs. The bids received were under budget so construction should begin in the spring. The project cost will be covered by grants and profits from airport operations with a minimal direct county expenditure.

A reminder: when the county processes driver licenses or vehicle registration renewals, the state reimburses the county and the revenue offsets property taxes. To have the county process your renewal, you can stop in at the auto bureau, mail your renewal to the County Clerks Office in Batavia, or just drop your renewal into one of the county's auto bureau drop boxes located throughout the county including outside the auto bureau on Court Street in Batavia, in front of the town office in LeRoy, and the one most convenient for many District 2 residents, in front of the village office in the heart of downtown Bergen at the corner of Rt. 19 (Lake St) and Buffalo St. Please make use of these drop boxes and help reduce your property taxes.

In closing, I would like to extend a thank you for allowing me to serve as your county legislator and wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.
