PROPOSED LOCAL LAW:

LOCAL LAW
NO. __OF 2025
A LOCAL LAW ESTABLISHING
A TEMPORARY MORATORIUM OF NEW SHORT-TERM
RENTALS IN THE TOWN OF BYRON

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BYRON TOWN BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. <u>Title and Authority</u> This Local Law shall be known as the Town of Byron Short-Term Rental Moratorium Law. It is adopted pursuant to the New York State Constitution Article IX and Municipal Home Rule Law Section 10.
- 2. <u>Purpose</u> The Town of Byron recognizes the growing interest in short-term rental property uses in the Town of Byron. It is further recognized that the short-term rental use is not currently

authorized or properly regulated under the Town of Byron Code and could be incompatible with the existing character and property uses in some areas of the Town of Byron. It is further recognized that this incompatibility would potentially compromise and inhibit more appropriate growth as established by the Town of Byron's comprehensive plan and Zoning Code and potential updates/amendments to same. Therefore, the purpose of this moratorium is to allow the Town Board the opportunity to draft a Short-Term Rental Law and/or evaluate this subject as part of any update to the Town's current Zoning Code as appropriate, including, but not limited to, a determination as to whether short-term rentals should be permitted within the Town of Byron and, if allowed, an analysis of where and in what manner short-term rentals are most appropriate and last, if appropriate, what perimeters, if any, should be applied thereto. These efforts are undertaken to promote and protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the Town of Byron.

- 3. <u>Application</u> This Local Law shall supersede and suspend those provisions of Chapters 3.03 (as applicable hereto), 9.03, 9.04, 9.05 and 9.06 of the Zoning Code of the Town of Byron related to boarding houses and bed and breakfasts and other similar or related and applicable provisions of the Zoning Code of the Town of Byron that require the planning board and/or town CEO to accept, process and approve special use permits for similar and related land use applications in the Town of within certain statutory time periods.
- 4. <u>Moratorium and Term</u> The town board hereby imposes a moratorium on any short-term, or quasi-short term, rentals on any parcel within the Town of Byron, for period beginning on the effective date of this Local Law and continuing until the last non-weekend/non-holiday day of the month six (6) months from the date of Local Law
- 5. <u>Extension</u> This moratorium may be extended for such additional periods as the town board may determine to be necessary to protect the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the town and accomplish the stated purposes and intent of this local law.
- 6. <u>Termination</u> This moratorium may be terminated earlier than its expiration date upon enactment of additional local legislation governing short-term rental within the town or at the discretion of the town board.
- 7. <u>Severance</u> The invalidity of any section, clause, sentence, or provision of this local law shall not affect the validity of any other parts of this local law that can be given effect without such invalid part or parts.
- 8. <u>Effective Date</u> This local law shall take effect upon filing by the office of the New York State Secretary of State or as otherwise provided by law.

MORATORIUM SHORT TERM RENTALS PUBLIC HEARING:

-Dean Ivison- States he wants to know what the harm of having airbnb's in Byron are

-Councilman Dilcher- States that he feels there should be safety codes in place and zoning laws to keep a handle on where these are going. He states the way he sees it is if you want one in your home then you should have to get approval from the surrounding neighbors

- -Peter Yasses- States he purchased his home in a residential area expecting that it would remain a residential area
- -Dean Ivison- States he feels this a direct attack on the Supervisor
- -Shannon Thompson- States that most towns have some kind of zoning law for airbnb's in place this is not unheard of
- -Supervisor Hensel states that she has a short term rental herself so she will not be voting on anything. She agrees with the previous comment it is a zoning issue. Several years ago this was brought up at the planning board and tabled. Supervisor Hensel states that she feels a moratorium is not necessary because that does not fix a problem; the zoning still needs to be figured out.
- -Melissa Ierlan- States that in the town of Waterport there was an airbnb set up in the front lawn of a property renting a boat out. There are people renting out barns, sheds, campers. If there is a fire who knows if there are fire extinguishers or smoke alarms. That is not something that we want to happen here in Byron
- -Marilyn Weinert- States she feels that the definition of short term rental needs to be clarified before the moratorium is passed
- -Barbie Starowitz- States she has an airbnb in Elba. She has house rules like quiet time is between 8pm 8am. She is renting to professional working people and has not had a problem.
- -Attorney John Sansone- States that this is simply a pause to figure out the answers you are all asking and to adjust the law for clarification if needed.
- -Barbie Starowitz states the planning board is overwhelmed already why not hold off for now

A MOTION was made by Councilman Klycek to close the public hearing at 7:01pm regarding at moratorium for short term rentals.

- -A decision needs to be made how to move forward with financing for the WWTP
- -To get the project through November 2025 financially the town is in need of approximately \$835,000.00
- -Options are an internal transfer or moving forward with a BAN

WATER IMPROVEMENT BENEFIT AREA #1 UPDATE:

- -Rochester Pipeline was on site May 12th working on restoration
- -Close out is tentatively set for the middle of summer

SOLAR PROJECT UPDATES:

Excelsior- The first installment of the hosting agreement was deposited May 5th into the NY Class account under its own account. The pilot agreement does not go into effect for two years -Complaint process is on the website for review email and phone are the preferred method of

- -Excelsior retained the sheriff's office for the next 2-3 weeks to help with safety concerns

-A team from Genesee County visited the community and neighboring towns to get an idea of what each town has to offer. There is a link on the town website for more information and a survey that can be completed until May 30^{th}

BOARD MEMBER RESIGNATION:

-Nathan Knickerbocker has resigned as councilman as of April 10, 2025

Councilman Dilcher makes the **MOTION** to accept the resignation of Nathan Knickerbocker as Town Councilman.

Councilman Thompson seconds the motion and carried the following vote:

- -Discussion was had how to move forward on filling the position at this time
- -The board agreed to advertise in the Batavia Daily News and the town website deadline will be May 30th, 2025 to apply for the open town board position

Councilman Dilcher makes the **MOTION** to advertise the position in the Batavia Daily News and on the town website.

Councilman Klycek seconds the motion and carried the following vote:

GATEKEEPER DISCUSSION:

- -Three people bid for the gate keeper position this year
 - a. \$550.00/increased to \$3,000.00
 - b. \$1,500.00
 - c. \$7500.00
- The increase from \$550 to \$3,000 by the first bidder caused the bid amount to be over the amount that was budgeted.
- -The Park Committee presented the Board with three options:
 - a. Increase the budget amount;
 - b. Assign a town employee to open and close the gate; and/or
 - c. Leave the gate closed unless the trestle park pavilion is rented.
- -The park committee states that they feel keeping the gate closed this year is the best option
- -Councilman Dilcher states that for next year the bids need to be sealed and opened in front of the parks committee so everyone knows what came in and when. He also states the gates should be kept locked this year given the circumstances. He thinks an option would be that there should be a deposit for the gate key and if the park is rented arrangements will need to be made to pick up the key at the town clerk's office during the town clerk's office hours
- -Councilman Klycek ask the parks committee if they knew why the bid was increased
- -Don Yaxley stated he was told the applicant's landlord gave him a hard time about putting such a low bid in. When asked who the landlord is Don stated he did not feel comfortable giving out that information
- -Councilman Klycek stated the board was in receipt of documentation stating that the committee was not going to advise the board that the bid was changed just that an overage in the budgeted amount had occurred. He stated that from the information he has it appears what occurred is highly unethical and he hopes this never happens again
- -The town attorney is asked for his opinion on the matter
- -John Sansone asks Don Yaxley if this quote is a single quote for reimbursement
- -Don Yaxley states yes
- -John Sansone states Michael Depumpo has two quotes in. He asks Don Yaxley which quote came in first, the \$550.00.
- -Don Yaxley states the \$550.00 bid.
- -John Sansone asked if on May 1st at the parks meeting if Michael Depumpo was hired at that meeting since he was the lowest bid
- -DonYaxley states that the parks committee did not hire anyone. That is up to the town board due to the overage in the quotes. If he had come in at budget or less we would have made the recommendation to hire
- -John Sansone states he has a copy of a text message and asks Don Yaxley who the text message was from.
- -Don Yaxley states it is from Michael DePumpo.
- -John Sansone asks Don Yaxley if this text message was provided to a member of the parks committee
- -Don Yaxley states yes it was
- -John Sansone asks if Michael DePumpo is here
- -Don Yaxley states he is not
- -John Sansone then states this text message states Kristie and Candy. Who are Kristie and

Candy? I think we know who Kristi and Candy are (For reference: the Kristi discussed in this statement is not Kristy Murphy the current Town Clerk).

- -He asks Don Yaxley if that what's the message says.
- -Don Yaxley states yes that is what it says
- -John Sansone asks Don Yaxley if anyone from the committee spoke to Michael regarding this message
- -Don Yaxley states he did ask Michael if he would consider lowering his bid back down. Don states Michael stated no, his second bid was firm.
- -John Sansone states that there are three options the town board has to move forward
- a. Take the lowest bid submitted, which was \$550.00. The bidder would need to do the job for \$550.00 since he is allowed only one bid. He would also need to be vetted of course
 - b. Have the park committee take turns as suggested
 - c. Keep the gate locked and hire no one and give the key out when rented
 - d. Put the request out again and have everyone resubmit bids and see what you get
- -Supervisor Hensel asks how the board wants to move forward
- -Councilman Thompson asks if the park committees would be willing to split the weeks up and rotate on a volunteer basis in order to keep the gates open
- -Don Yaxley states he would need to present that to the other committee members and see if that would work
- -Councilman Dilcher states he thinks the gates should be kept locked and a key given if the park is rented

Supervisor Hensel makes the **MOTION** to keep the parks gates closed for the 2025 season and not hire a gatekeeper. Councilman Thompson seconds the motion and carried the following vote:

- -Hometown Hero flags arrived this week.
- -Thank you to the highway department in advance for all the work to help me make this happen.
- -The flags will be up in time for the Memorial Day parade.
- -Thank you to everyone who donated to the program it wouldn't be possible without all of you.
- -After paying for the hometown hero flags and hardware there is a surplus amount of money left. The town clerk asks the board to make a motion to earmark \$557.23 to use for this project in case of any repairs or issues with any of the flags.

Councilman Klycek makes the **MOTION** to have the accountants earmark \$557.23 to be used for hometown hero project repairs if needed in the future.

Councilman Thompson seconds the motion and carried the following vote:

- -Town Clerk audit came back a couple weeks ago and was sent to the board for review.
- -Kleen-All reached out a few weeks ago asking if the town was interested in getting the floors and carpets cleaned again at the town hall. After speaking to our cleaner she thought that the linoleum floors could use to be polished but, did not feel the carpets needed to be cleaned. Town clerk asks if the town board would like the floors cleaned at this time.
- -Supervisor Hensel states she would like the rugs replaced in the entry way. She asks the town

clerk to price out replacing the entry rugs

Supervisor Hensel makes the **MOTION** to have the floors cleaned Councilman Dilcher seconds the motion and carried the following vote:

- -A letter was received from Edmunds/BAS stating the sewer billing software is no longer going to be supported. An option to upgrade is available and a quote was given. - -Dealing with USDA getting some finances taken care of regarding some payments that were not supposed to be taken out. The funds have been replaced by the USDA now
- -Fielding complaints from residents regarding the excelsior project
- -GAM meeting is tomorrow at 7:00pm
- -There is a proposed land bank meeting upcoming at the county. That was a discussion previously had regarding the unsafe structure property that could be helpful
- -Updated Decommissioning Bond came in just before the meeting. It was due to expire next month therefore it has been amended to reflect a new date. Supervisor Hensel is looking for permission to sign the amended decommissioning bond subject to attorney approval.

-I am told that 7548 Byron Holley Road has been sold at auction. As I read the zoning ordinance it states:

(v) A Special Use Permit shall expire in the event the permitted use discontinues for amore than six (6) months or if all the required improvements are not made within one (1) year of the date the permit is issued. The Zoning Enforcement Officer shall issue a Nonce of Abandonment in form of a letter to the owner of record by registered mail. If after sixty (60) days the owner has not provided satisfactory proof that the special use did not cease, the Planning Board shall revoke the Special Use Permit.


Under no circumstances shall any applicant or any one on behalf of any applicant

- -I did an inspection April 17, 2024 and at that time the woman who met me named Angela said that they hadn't been open for several months as the owner had gotten married etc. The club as far as I am concerned has not been open for business in over a year.
- I have been told there are people living upstairs and from the records I read in 2023 there was nothing allowed upstairs as it was not to code.

Section 11.12 Adult Uses

- (a) Restrictions Affecting Adult Uses
 - (i) Adult uses, including but not limited to, adult bookstore, adult motion-picture theater, adult mini-motion-picture theater, adult entertainment cabaret, and clubs (private or charter) shall be permitted subject to the following restrictions:
 - No such adult uses shall be permitted, operated, conducted, or located within:
 - a) Five-hundred (500) feet of another existing adult use
 - Five-hundred (500) feet of the boundaries of any Residential or Agricultural-Residential Zoning District
 - c) Two thousand (2,000) feet of a school, place of worship or playground
 - 2) No such adult use shall be permitted, operated, conducted or located in any zoning district except an Industrial (I-1) District.
 - 3) Such use shall meet all requirements of Local Law 2002 and in the event of any conflict of the Local Law with this Local Law, the provision of that Law shall control.

-This afternoon I received a packet of information from the planning board chairman Chris Hilbert and included was Local Law #1 of 2002 which amended the towns zoning ordinance when it comes to adult use provisions. In it there is a statement about minimum separation distances between an adult business and a residence being 500 ft. a public hall 500 ft. another adult business 100 ft and a church, school, day care center, park or playground 500 ft.



- -The planning board has been doing zoning updates and this building was going to be included in the R1 Residential district to help with the lack of housing in the county if it could be turned into a duplex or single family home.
- -A letter from the town of Stafford has been received and in it they are asking the town to do something about the excessive use of jake breaks on the dump trucks, tractor trailers coming and going to the various solar projects. I have also received a phone complaint from a resident on Byron Holley Road about the same thing beginning as early as 6am during the week.
- -Supervisor Hensel asks for clarification did the special use permit expire
- -CEO/ZEO states that it states that in the event the permitted use discontinues for more than six months it expires. The business has not been operating since last April as far as she knows.
